About the Program:

Psychologists in all practice settings regularly encounter ethical challenges in their day-to-day work. Effective navigation of these challenges is facilitated not only by clinical competence, but by knowledge of ethical decision-making models, ready access to relevant ethical and practice standards, and experience in their application.

The ability to identify and distinguish various dimensions of dilemmas enables psychologists to more effectively make decisions that take into account not only the clinical features of a case, but also the ethical, legal, and risk management aspects. These perspectives may be discrete or may overlap, and best practice involves seeing the issues through each of these four lenses.

Presenters will describe two approaches to ethical decision making and will illustrate the application of these models to a critical and timely ethical dilemma. Participants will have opportunities to share some of their own ethical questions and dilemmas. The group will then practice applying the models to the shared dilemmas.

Participants will be able to:

1. Identify resources that can be accessed to facilitate ethical decision making in every day practice.

- 2. Discern the ethical, legal, clinical, and risk management aspects of an ethical dilemma.
- 3. Describe a five-step model of ethical decision making and demonstrate its application.

About the Presenters:

Janet T. Thomas, Psy.D., LP, received her doctoral degree in counseling psychology from the University of St. Thomas in 1995. She practices in St. Paul where she provides psychotherapy, ethics consultation, and clinical supervision, specializing in working with psychologists facing ethical challenges, board complaints, and lawsuits. Her publications include *The Ethics of Supervision and Consultation: Practical Guidance for Mental Health Professionals*, published by the APA.

Janet Schank, Ph.D., LP, is a licensed psychologist with over 35 years of experience and currently has a private practice in St. Paul, MN. Dr. Schank is especially interested in ethical dilemmas across a range of small communities and has presented locally and nationally on this and other ethics topics. She has written several articles and book chapters on ethical issues and is the co-author of the book, *Ethical Practice in Small Communities: Challenges and Rewards for Psychologists*, published by the APA.
